

AND THE HISTORY OF OUR PARISH

a mountain, a red bandana fluttered like a flag in the wind. Some miners, trying their hardest to strike it rich in 1869, marked a spot with the piece of cloth before returning to Salt Lake City. The sample piece of rock they took back down to the valley, later discovered to contain silver, caused an eruption of immigration back to that red bandana. A tent encampment eventually developed, and on July 4th, 1872, a makeshift American Flag was raised to establish a new community: "Park City, Utah."

The growth in population, caused by the mining boom, brought tons of Irish, Catholic miners to the new town. The tough and dedicated immigrants pushed to have a parish church of their own, one where they could receive the world's greatest treasure: the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ.

This small, original chapel, which was completed in 1882, was made of wood and also dedicated on July 4th. A fire caused it to burn down a year later. In 1884, a new church was begun and completed. This one was of stone and still stands today as Utah's oldest Catholic church.

The church, though, would be tested throughout its lifetime. In June of 1884, Fr. Blake was assigned to Park City. A month later, on July 4th at 8 PM, smoke was discovered at St. Mary's. Volunteer firefighters rushed to the scene, but had trouble setting up their hoses to put out the fire. By the time the errors were fixed, much of the church was burned.


The stone church would undergo another trial by fire in 1950, but the edifice stood like a stone wall. Convinced that Park City and the community was fading and unable to support the church, Bishop Hunt of Salt Lake City was set to abolish the parish.

However, Jim Ivers — who would later donate the land where our main church stands today — personally travelled to meet the prelate, and after some words with him, assured him the parish would survive and convinced him to allow the needed repairs of the Old Town Chapel.

If July 4th means anything to the St. Mary's community, it represents the dedication, devotion, and mission of the parish to the community around it. Finally free to have their own priest and parish, the early Catholic inhabitants of Park City realized it was something too precious to ever let go of. Their church, their Masses, their sense of community, was a beacon of freedom and fellowship when they were done working in the mines. The church was their opportunity to worship God amidst all their other obligations.

Despite the hardships, struggles, and setbacks, the history of St. Mary's reminds us we should be joyful and truly have a grateful Fourth of July.


