Just as parents give their child food, love, and a name before the child can ask for them, they also give the gift of God's grace through Baptism.



WHAT DOES THE BIBLE SAY?



JESUS SAID:
"Let the little children come to me and do not prevent them."
(Matthew 19:14)



JESUS TAUGHT:
"Unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God." (John 3:5)



WHOLE HOUSEHOLDS WERE BAPTIZED in the New Testament (Acts 16:15, 16:33, 1 Corinthians 1:16), suggesting that families—including children—received Baptism together.

DID THE EARLY CHURCH BAPTIZE INFANTS?



YES. Christians have baptized infants from the earliest centuries. Around A.D. 250, Origen wrote that the Church had received infant Baptism from the Apostles themselves.
