They were already baptized, yet the Apostles laid hands on them so they could RECEIVE the Holy Spirit.

ACTS 19:5-6



Paul baptized some followers in Ephesus...

then laid hands on them, and the Holy Spirit came upon them.

Again, Baptism and the laying on of hands are distinct.

HEBREWS 6:2



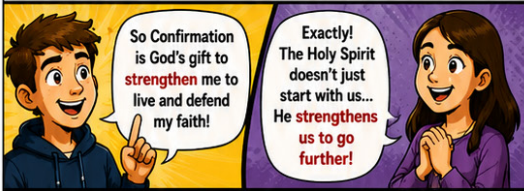
